Alex Snoeren Elected IEEE Fellow

CSE professor and vice chair Alex C. Snoeren was elected to the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) [Fellow class of 2020](#) for his "contributions to management and security of networked systems." IEEE Fellow recognition is the organization's highest honor for electrical engineers, computer engineers and computer scientists.

Research Open House

The keynote was followed by presentations on security and programming languages, robotics, bioinformatics, AI and other topics. After lunch, an industry panel discussed the joys and perils of the working world, followed by the open lab segment and a poster session. Congratulations to Michael Barrow, whose poster took first place in the industry category. Audrey Randall was runner-up. Jens Luebeck won first place in research. Saransh Gupta was runner-up.



CSE Distinguished Alumni

Also at the Research Open House, Taner Halicioğlu and Tim Sherwood were honored as the inaugural CSE Distinguished Alumni. Halicioğlu graduated in 1996 and worked at Loudcloud, Ebay and Facebook, where he was the first full-time employee. He now shares his vast knowledge and experience as a CSE lecturer and angel investor. The Halicioğlu Data Science Institute was named in his honor.

Tim Sherwood graduated in 2003 and is a professor of Computer Science and Associate Vice Chancellor for Research at UC Santa Barbara. Sherwood's contributions to novel program analysis, particularly his work on basic block vectors, fundamentally changed the research landscape. In 2016, he was awarded a SIGARCH Maurice Wilkes Award from the Association for Computing Machinery for his outstanding contributions to computer architecture. He also co-founded hardware security startup Tortuga Logic.

For the second year in a row, the UCSD Graduate Women in Computing (GradWIC) group hosted a GradWIC Social Hour. 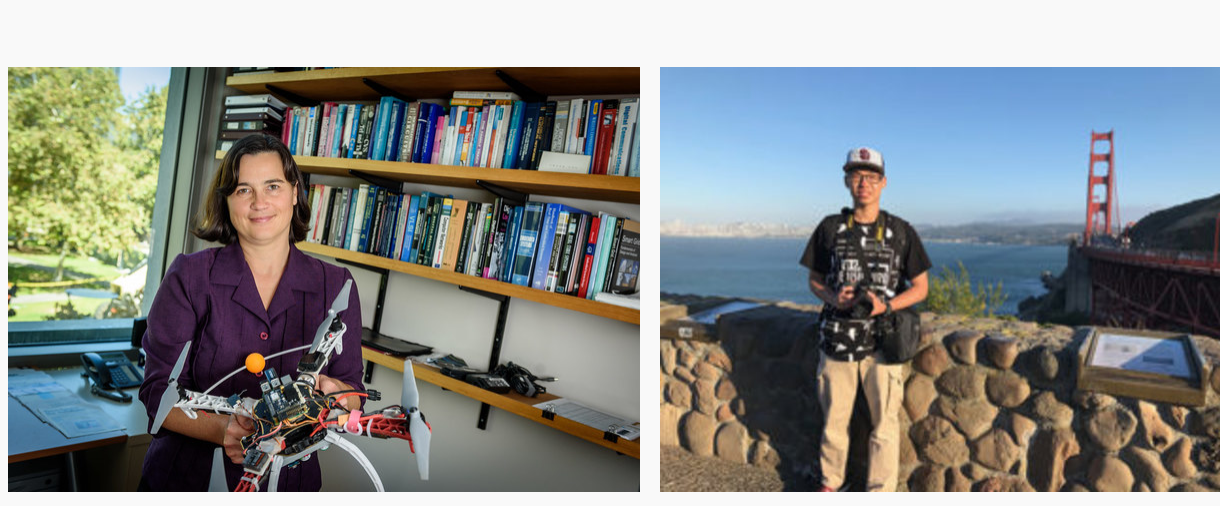

Brain-Inspired Hyperdimensional Computing for IoT Applications

Professor Tajana Rosing has been awarded a [\\$500,000 National Science Foundation grant](#) to advance hyper-dimensional computing, which seeks to process data in parallel, similar to the human brain. The hope is this approach will use less power, be more secure and generally operate more efficiently.

Weiyang Wang Recognized by CRA

The Computer Research Association has named Weiyang (Frank) Wang a runner-up in this year's [Outstanding Undergraduate Researchers](#) competition. The award recognizes students who show tremendous research potential. A senior, Wang's work focuses on improving data center architectures. In particular, he is studying how TCP and other protocols work in data centers using optical circuit switching.
