

uno Bandeira receives 2013 Sloan Research Fellowsh




An expert in bioinformatics and computational mass spectrometry at the University of California, San Diego is among the 2013 crop of young faculty members identified by the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation as "rising stars, the nageneration of scientific leaders." Nuno Bandeira – who leads a repository of the ambitious goal of collecting and organizing all mass spectrometry dated the world – has dual faculty appointments in the Computer Science and Engineering (CSE) department, and the Skaggs School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences. Bandeira is one of four UC San Diego assistant professors selected to receive Sloan Research Fellowships in 2013 (from among 126 recipients across the U.S. and Canada). The other UC San Diego awardees are Adrian loana (Mathematics), Eva-Maria Schötz Collins (Physiand Biology), and Scripps Institution of Oceanography assistant professor Martín Tresguerres. Bandeira did his undergraduate and Master's degrees Computer Science and Applied Artificial Intelligence, respectively, at the

w University of Lisbon, in Portugal. He was accepted into CSE's doctoral program in bioinformatics, where ned his Ph.D. under advisor Pavel Pevzner.
